

Reham Abou El Fadl Ibrahim



Reham is a lecturer in the Pediatric Dentistry and Dental Public Health Department, Faculty of Dentistry, Ain Shams University (ASU) in Cairo. She graduated in Dentistry in 2000 and proceeded to finish an MSc. (2006) and DSc. (2011) in Pediatric Dentistry at ASU. She also got a diploma in Total Quality Management for Health Care Reform from The American University in Cairo (AUC) in 2008. In 2012, Reham was nominated to collaborate with the Dental Department at the Ministry of Health and Population in Egypt to plan for a nationwide oral health survey. The project was conducted over one year (2013-2014) under the auspices of the World Health Organization (WHO), country office in Cairo where she took the responsibility of managing the project and participated as a principal investigator as well. In July 2014, she was awarded a Chevening Scholarship funded by the Foreign and

Commonwealth Office (FCO) and partner organizations to study an MPH at Imperial College, London. Back in Cairo, she finished a six-month internship in the Health policy and planning Unit, Health System Department at the Eastern Mediterranean Region office of the WHO in March 2017. In parallel, as a consultant in the Social Research center at the AUC, Reham planned for a joint workshop with the WHO EMRO on ‘‘Health in All Policies’’ approach. Currently, Reham is the Director of the Center for Community Services Projects a multidisciplinary research center which was established in November 2018 and is administered by the Community Service and Environmental Development sector at Faculty of Dentistry, ASU. The center focuses on addressing common and pressing health issues and health inequalities by collaborating with other partners to conduct community-based participatory research and translate research findings into programs and practices for health promotion and disease prevention.
