



Dr Aimee Lee, BDS (Hons, Malaysia) MSc (London)

Aimee Lee is a dental surgeon with experience in both the civil and private sectors in Malaysia and a Chevening Scholar. She earned her Bachelor's Degree in 2013 from AIMST University with First Class Honours, and was awarded Best Dental Student of 2013. She has since completed an MSc in Public Health – Health Promotion in the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) with distinction, funded by the Foreign & Commonwealth Office United Kingdom and LSHTM. Her master's thesis was a systematic review on oral health promotion interventions in underserved populations including displaced populations, migrants, ethnic minorities and economically-disadvantaged groups.

She is a member of Health in Humanitarian Crises Centre in LSHTM, a student ambassador and programme representative in the MSc Public Health Programme Committee at the school.

Her work in Malaysia involves providing primary dental care in low-resource settings, including maternal and child dental care in rural indigenous populations as part of mobile dental team. She was an auditor for handwashing and medication error as part of WHO World Alliance for Patient Safety. She was also the principle investigator on a qualitative research to reduce undetected caries in primary school children by dental nurses.

As a dental student, she pioneered an oral health awareness campaign “Healthy Teeth, Bright Smiles” and published the findings of the campaign in the International Poster Journal of Dentistry & Oral Medicine. She also presented the outcomes of the campaign at the 11th Annual Scientific Meeting of IADR (SEA Division).
